A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



With your generous support, FOOD For Lane County responded to the challenges of a second year of COVID. Because of the pandemic, our community partners experienced a fluctuating and unpredictable demand for food assistance, making it difficult to get the right amount of food to the right place at the right time.

Part of our response has been to develop a new ongoing mobile pantry program, which has opened up a whole new range of partners and places for getting food to marginalized communities and those in need.

We welcomed volunteers back into our kitchen and gardens by observing strict safety protocols. We moved all of our nutrition education classes online in English and Spanish. And we figured out ways to conduct community food drives under pandemic conditions.

Thanks to the wonderful generosity of people like you, we also completed a four-year \$10 million fundraising effort for our Building To Serve capital campaign, significantly expanding our capacity to reduce hunger in Lane County.

Thank you for making such a difference in our community.

Janice relies on her local food pantry for a few staples to get her through each month. She has lived in rural Lane County for 40 years. Before retirement she worked at McKenzie-Willamette Medical Center in Springfield for 35 years. A little over a year ago she lost her husband of 52 years. Food pantries make up a small but critical piece of the countywide network FFLC works with to distribute food. The network is more than 150 partners strong and includes pantries, meal sites, shelters and supplemental food programs.

When COVID began, we saw many people turn to FFLC for help for the first time. Since then, the need we saw in those early months of the pandemic has leveled off some. FFLC collects food from all sources. King Estate Winery is a long-time partner in the work we do. This fall, the winery donated 90% of its orchard harvest, including 15,000 pounds of Bartlett pears and 7,000 pounds of Gala, Golden Delicious and Braeburn apples. That was amazing news for the families and individuals we serve, because fresh produce is one of the most expensive food items.

Laurie is 69 and lives in Springfield. Like many Lane County seniors, she lives on a fixed income and needs a little extra help putting food on her table. FFLC helps fill the meal gap for low-income seniors, providing daily hot meals through Meals on Wheels and a monthly food box through our Senior Grocery Program. Both programs provide seniors with foods necessary to a balanced diet.

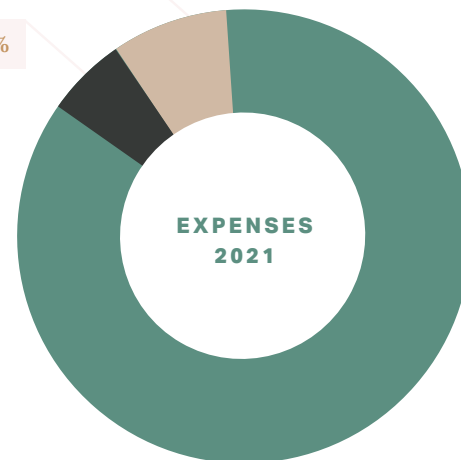

REVENUES

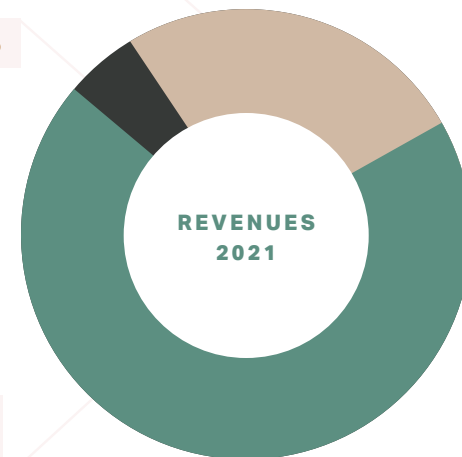
